Dear Parent or Guardian:

The No Child Left behind Act of 2001 requires all states and school districts in receipt of Title I assistance issue annual “report cards” to parents. The purpose of the report card is to give parents information about their child’s school in terms of academic achievement and the professional qualifications of the teachers.

No Child Left Behind requires that test results for reading and mathematics be reported annually. Tulsa Public Schools continues to be proud of the performance of our students on the Oklahoma Core Curriculum Tests and End of Instruction Tests. These tests are used by the Oklahoma State Department of Education to measure student achievement in schools around the state.

The report cards are divided into three sections:

- Summaries of the Academic Performance Index and accountability data of the district and each school site
- Summaries of the professional qualifications of teachers in the district and each school site
- Summaries of the Oklahoma State Testing Program assessments at each grade level of the district and each school site
