

## *Penn Elementary Uniform Colors for the 2016-17 School Year*

### TOPS

- Solid **red, black, white, or navy blue** short or long sleeve shirts with collars or Peter Pan blouses for girls.
- Solid **red, black, white, or navy blue** sweatshirts or sweaters may be worn inside the classroom during cooler temperatures (no print or logos, please).
- Hoodies may be worn to school, but **must be left in lockers** for school security and safety reasons.
- Students in grades 2-6 must have shirts tucked in at all times.

### Bottoms

- **Khaki, black, or navy blue pants** with pleated or flat front.
- **Khaki, black, or navy blue** capris, jumpers, shorts, and/or skorts with pleated or flat front.
- Skirt and jumper length must be no shorter than 3" from the floor while child is kneeling. Shorts and skorts must extend below the fingertips when the child is standing with hands to their sides. This applies to free dress days as well.
- Girls may wear leggings that are the Penn colors underneath a skirt. They may not be worn as pants.
- Belts – Black or brown belt must be worn with pants and/or shorts with loops. (Grades 3-6).

Pants, capris, shorts, and skirts must fit well and not be oversized or undersized. Pants and shorts must fit at the waist and must not sag. Waistbands may be regular or elastic.

### Shoes

Shoes must be close-toed and cover the heel. Shoes should lace, buckle, zip, or Velcro. Examples include tennis shoes and loafers.

### Jackets Allowed in the Classroom

- **Solid red, black, white, or navy blue** button down cardigan sweaters
- **Solid red, black, white or navy blue** sweatshirt without a hood or pockets.
- Large or baggy jackets or sweatshirts are not permitted.
- Hoodies (sweatshirt or sweatshirt jackets with hoods) are not permitted in the classroom. Student must leave them in their lockers during the school day.

Any coats or jackets worn to and from school that do not conform to these guidelines must be kept in the student's locker during the day.
