TULSA, Okla. – The Tulsa Board of Education is encouraging the public to give feedback on two options for revised board district boundaries options at a special meeting on **Dec. 8 at 5:15 p.m. in the Cheryl Selman Room of the Education Service Center (3027 S. New Haven Ave.).**

To ensure that every Tulsan is appropriately represented by the Tulsa Board of Education, state law requires that school districts complete a redistricting process every decade after the completion of the United States Census. During this process, board district boundaries are revised and redrawn based on population, but do not change student attendance or school district boundaries.

The *two maps were developed through a partnership with the Indian Nations Council of Governments and revised with feedback from board and community members. During the meeting, the Board will discuss and hear community feedback on both options.

The Board is encouraging the community to give their feedback. There are two ways to sign up to provide comment during the special meeting:

- Signing up at <u>www.tulsaschools.org/comment</u> by 4pm on Thursday, Dec. 8
- Signing up in-person; sign-up must be completed by Thursday, Dec. 8 at 5:10 p.m.



- For Tulsa Voter, the redistricting process only affects which board member represents you based on your home address.
- For Tulsa schools, the redistricting process only affects which board member represents the board district in which the school is located.


