

COLLEGE AND CAREER READY GRADUATES

Our secondary students do far more than just earn their high school diplomas! At Tulsa Public Schools, our students can:

- Earn college credits through Advanced Placement courses and concurrent enrollment at Tulsa Community College;
- Gain hands-on work experience through internships and career and technology courses that lead to recognized industry certifications;
- Earn vocational skills by taking courses at Tulsa Tech;
- Explore the performing arts with courses including dance, drama, and vocal music, and
- Complete an Individualized Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) to prepare for college, career and life.

Our high schools provide a wide range of program offerings including culinary arts, graphic design, broadcast media, agricultural education, business, marketing, STEM, and information technology. Students benefit from learning in safe and supportive school environments with teachers who are committed to supporting each child to achieve their greatest potential.



All Tulsa Public Schools students have access to rigorous course offerings designed to prepare them for the greatest success in college, careers, and life. Our goal is to help all of our secondary students realize their talents and set them on the path to be college-and-career-ready.

Through student-centered learning experiences, students are provided a rich variety of learning opportunities including advanced placement courses, concurrent enrollment opportunities, and career tech programs.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement courses allow students to challenge themselves, explore their interests, and earn college credit and placement. Students get a taste of college-level work while developing the academic skills they need for college success.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

Tulsa Public Schools partners with Tulsa Community College to offer concurrent enrollment for juniors and seniors who meet the academic and testing requirements. Concurrent enrollment provides opportunities for students to take on the challenge of college coursework before they graduate from high school and receive both high school and college credit for courses.

CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION

Career and Technical Education (CTE) allows middle and high school students to gain hands-on learning experience in areas such as agriculture, culinary arts, digital media or pre-engineering. Students can earn industry certifications and build workplace competencies in their field of interest. Tulsa Public Schools also partners with Tulsa Tech to allow students access to a wide variety of vocational education programs.

All Tulsa Public Schools high school students complete an Individual Career Academic Plan which is a student-driven and adult-supported multi-year process that intentionally guides students as they explore career, academic, and postsecondary opportunities.
