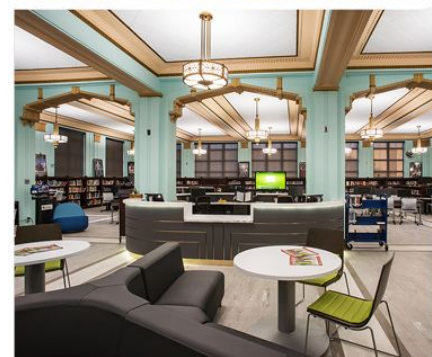


The 2021 Bond for Tulsa Public Schools is a investment in Tulsa children, teachers, and families that will make an impact in every school

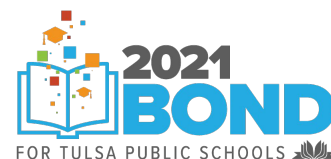

Why is bond funding so important for Tulsa Public Schools?

We rely on \$70-\$80 million in bond funds annually to support everything from textbooks and classroom resources to building maintenance and repairs:

- With an average age of 61 years, our buildings need continuous maintenance;
- More than 75% of all curricular materials and 100% of library materials are bond-funded;
- Bond funds provide for art materials, musical instruments, and athletic equipment.



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What is in the 2021 Bond for Tulsa Public Schools?

PROPOSITION 1: **SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS -** \$166.8 MILLION

Proposition 1 will keep **all** of our schools and buildings safe, accessible, and in good repair.

PROPOSITION 2: **STUDENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY -** \$90.7 MILLION

Proposition 2 ensures that **all** students and schools have the educational technology that 21st century learners need and deserve.

PROPOSITION 3: **TRANSPORTATION -** \$17.3 MILLION

Proposition 3 will provide safe, comfortable, and environmentally sustainable transportation for every Tulsa student.

PROPOSITION 4: **QUALITY LEARNING MATERIALS AND PROGRAMS -**\$139.3 MILLION

Proposition 4 will invest in providing exceptional learning experiences for every child.

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PROPOSITION 1: SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS - \$166.8 MILLION

Proposition 1 will keep **all** of our schools and buildings safe, accessible, and in good repair by focusing on three key areas:

» Building and space ADA-accessibility for **all** Tulsans;

» Campus safety and security enhancements; and

» Safe, welcoming, and joyful learning environments.

- Safety and security includes security cameras, fire panel replacements and alarm systems, fencing, secure entries, police dispatch equipment, etc.;
- Renovations and roofing based on facilities need and building age;
- ADA-accessibility improvements based on a 10-year plan;
- Multi-purpose dining and kitchens will replace 60 year old serving lines and equipment and renovate secondary dining areas into multi-purpose areas for use throughout the day; and
- Air quality/HVAC improvements will be federally funded through CARES Act dollars and include automated fresh air on-demand upgrades and system replacements as needed.

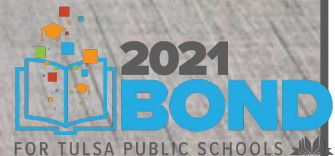
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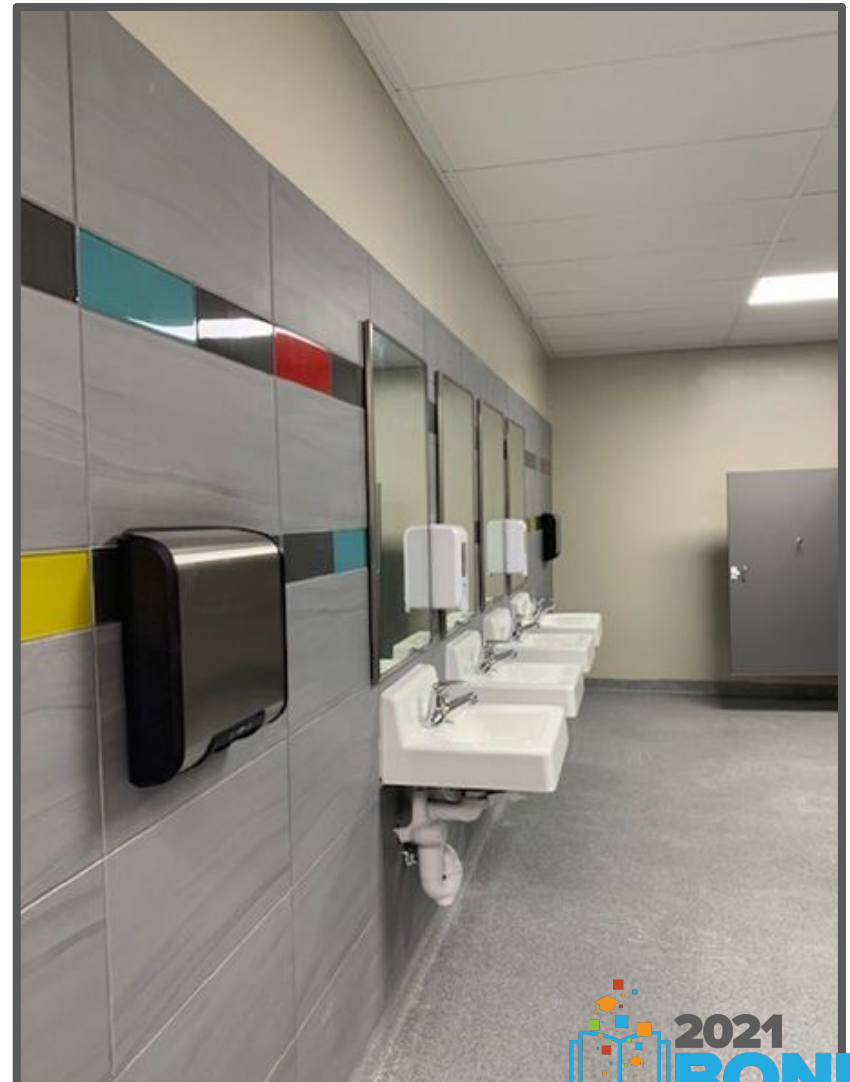

- Repairing crumbling sidewalks and parking lots.



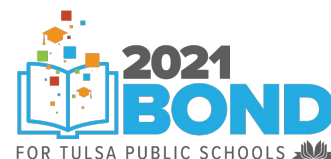
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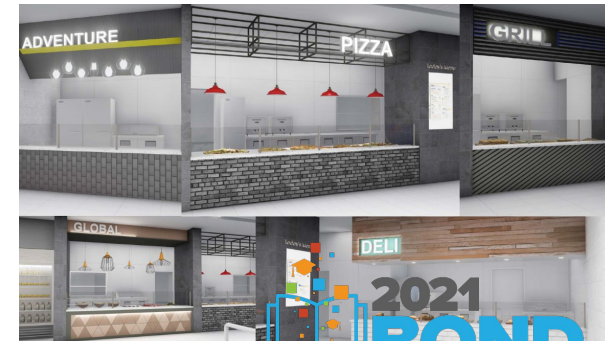
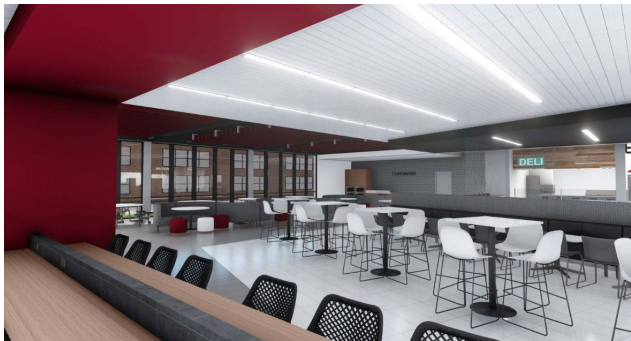

Highlights of Proposition 1 in District 3

- **Full interior renovation** at Burroughs, Hawthorne, and Whitman elementary schools including replacing aging infrastructure, remodeling restrooms, updating kitchen equipment, and ADA-accessibility improvements
- **ADA-accessibility improvements**, including restroom remodels and exit modifications at McLain High School, Central Middle and High School, Tulsa Learning Academy, and Tulsa MET Junior High and High School
- **Kitchen and cafeteria renovations** at John Hope Franklin Elementary School
- **Cafeteria redesign** at Central and McLain high schools to create flexible multi-use spaces for students and teachers
- **Parking lot repaving and exterior lighting** improvements at all schools



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PROPOSITION 2: STUDENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY - \$90.7 MILLION

Proposition 2 ensures that **all** students and schools have the educational technology that 21st century learners need and deserve by:

» Providing **every** student with the learning technology they need to be prepared for success in school and beyond;

» Making technology improvements that improve communication between schools and families; and

» Keeping our critical network systems operating securely.

- Student and classroom technology includes 99% of all the technology used in the district, from computers for our students and teachers to our wireless networks and software;
- The 2015 Bond was critical to funding updated technology and supported our transition to distance learning during the pandemic;
- Flexibility, mobility and access is key on- and off-campus, and the 2021 Bond will continue those investments.

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Highlights of Proposition 2 in District 3

- Computing devices for all students and staff
- New educational and instructional technology and network systems upgrades for all schools
- New digital marquees at Anderson, Burroughs, Celia Clinton, Hamilton, Hawthorne, John Hope Franklin, and Whitman elementary schools, Monroe, Central, McLain, TRAICE, Unity Learning Academy, Dual Language Academy, and Greenwood Leadership Academy



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PROPOSITION 3: TRANSPORTATION - \$17.3 MILLION

Proposition 3 will provide safe, comfortable, and environmentally sustainable transportation for every Tulsa student by:

» Providing student transport vehicles to **every** high school for off-site learning and enrichment opportunities;

» Improving student rider experiences with wifi-enabled activity buses and applications for parents to track bus arrival times; and

» Funding our district's continued transition to environmentally-friendly buses using compressed natural gas.

- New, smaller vans to transport secondary students to partner programs and other off-campus learning opportunities and experiences.

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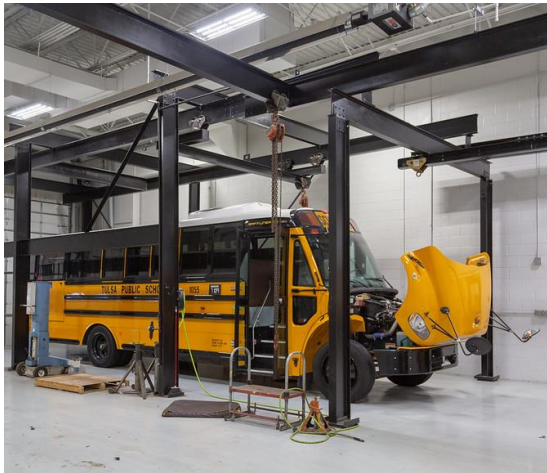

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PROPOSITION 4: QUALITY LEARNING MATERIALS AND PROGRAMS - \$139.3 MILLION

Proposition 4 will invest in providing exceptional learning experiences for every child by focusing on five critical areas:

» Creating strong STEM education, career- and college-ready programming;
» Giving **all** Tulsa students the same opportunities to succeed;

» Investing in our educators;
» Nurturing the whole child with strengthened arts and athletics programs; and

» Expanding access to early childhood education, dual language learning, and other proven initiatives.

- Ongoing teacher and staff development to support student learning with high-quality, college- and career-ready materials.

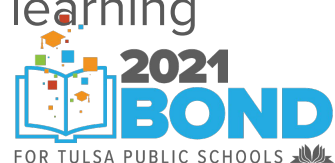
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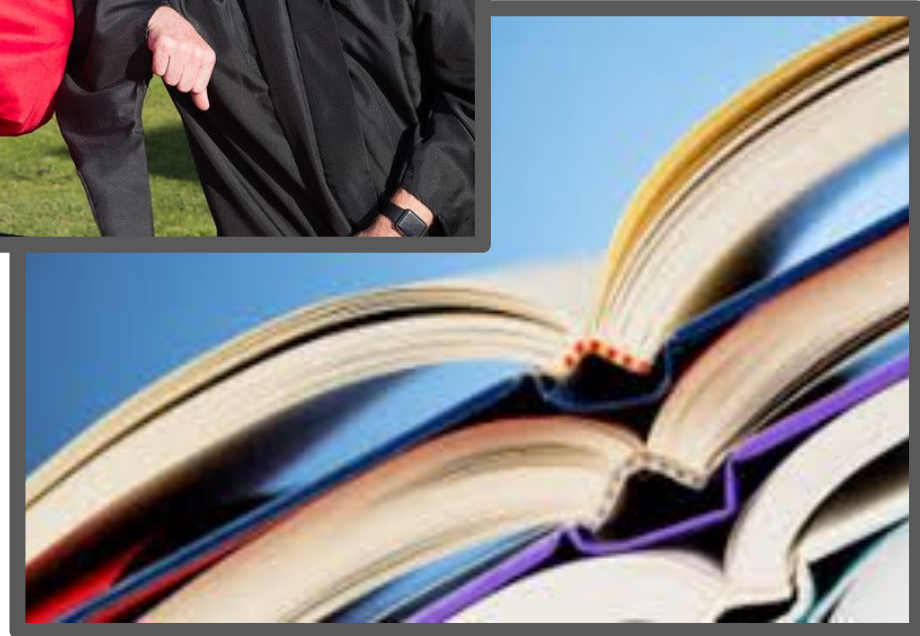
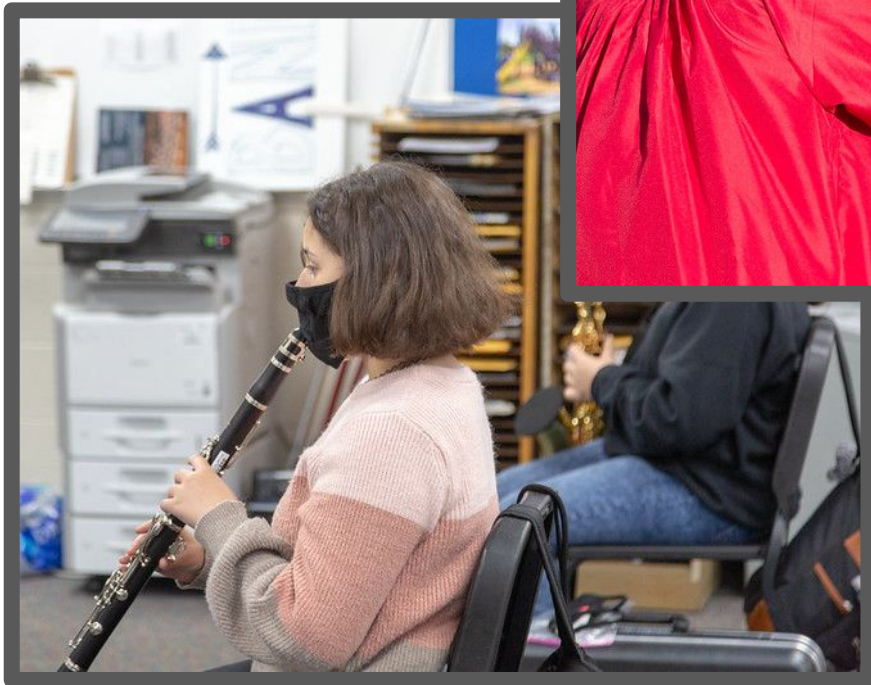
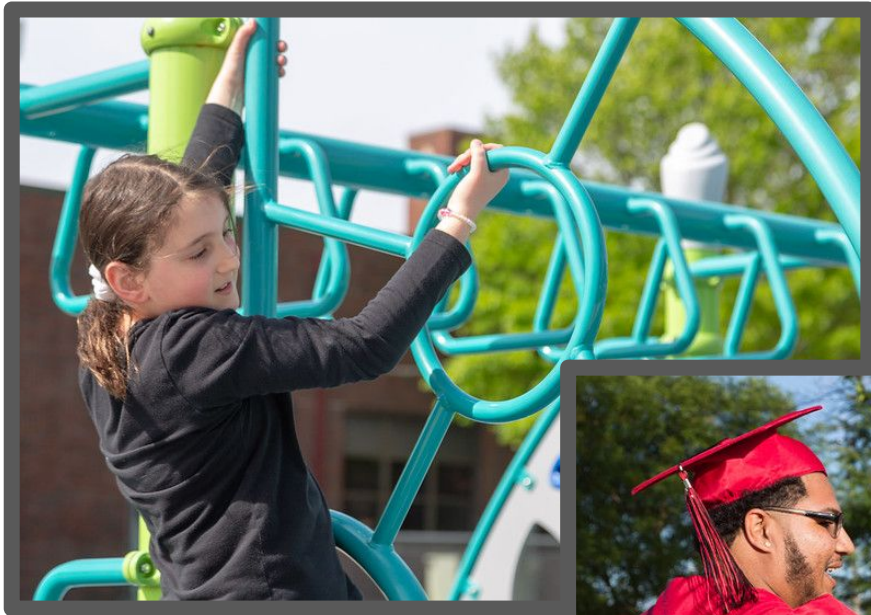
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Highlights of Proposition 4 in District 3

In addition to curriculum and library resources for every class and every student...

- **Science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) lab remodels** at McLain High School, Monroe Demonstration Academy, TRAICE, Tulsa MET Junior High and High School, Central Middle and High School, Tulsa Learning Academy
- **Fine arts budgets** for all elementary and secondary schools for art equipment, band instruments and uniforms.
- **Physical education budgets** for every school
- New **playground structures** at John Hope Franklin and Hawthorne elementary schools



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Highlights of Proposition 4 in District 3

➤ Auditorium improvements at:

- Central: *Lighting, curtains, sound system, paint, ADA lift*
- McLain: *Lighting, curtains, sound system, seats, paint and ADA lift.*
- Monroe: *Lighting, Curtains, sound system*

➤ Athletic improvements:

- Central: Turf replacement, track resurfacing, and more
- McLain: Turf replacement, track resurfacing, pool refresh, stadium waterproofing and more
- Monroe: Pool refresh, practice field improvements and more

TOTAL INVESTMENT IN PATRICK HENRY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: \$1.8 MILLION

PROPOSITION 1: SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS - \$100,206

- » Security cameras and radios
- » Parking lot, sidewalk, and exterior LED lighting
- » School and classroom furniture
- » Air quality/HVAC replacements - federally funded by the CARES Act

PROPOSITION 2: STUDENT AND CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY - \$1.1 MILLION

- » Network and systems upgrades
- » Student and teacher technology

PROPOSITION 3: TRANSPORTATION

- » Funding from Proposition 3 will ensure that all students have access to safe, comfortable, and dependable transportation.

PROPOSITION 4: QUALITY LEARNING MATERIALS AND PROGRAMS - \$617,418

- » Textbooks and learning materials
- » Library digital and print resources
- » School projects funds
- » Wellness and physical education

- Nominated by School Board members
- Worked with district teams to develop the four 2021 Bond Propositions

Tulsa Voters

- Decide whether to approve the bond packages

Citizen Bond Oversight Committee

- Nominated by School Board members upon passage of the bond
- Serve throughout the 5 year life of the bonds
- Meet bi-monthly to monitor progress on projects and review budgets
- Consider and approve any changes to the bond plan

Any changes to the bonds must be approved by the Citizen Bond Oversight Committee before they are presented to the School Board.

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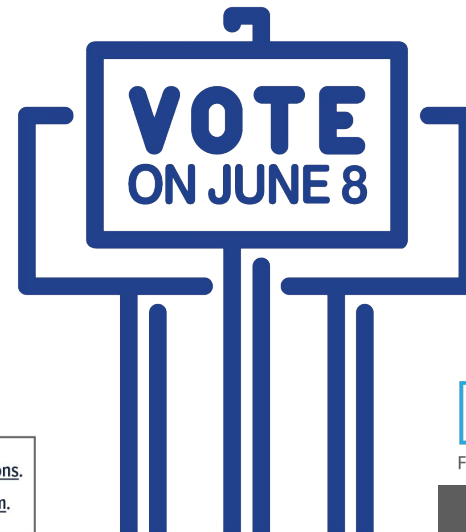
